I. Applicant must:

a. Have attended at least two years at William Penn Elementary.

b. Be a current member of the Senior Class of Bethel Park High School.

c. Provide evidence that he/she has been accepted and will be attending a college, university, or school offering post high school training.

d. Be actively involved in one of the following: school activity/sport, community/volunteer activity or organization, or be employed.

e. Be on track for successful completion of all high school requirements OR be in good academic standing. Applicant must submit proof of this by providing a print out of grades.

f. Student must include a letter of recommendation from a current teacher.

II. In addition to the completed application, the applicant must:a. Answer the following question (total of 250 words maximum, 12 point font, typed, double-spaced, on a separate sheet of paper.)

What is the hardest thing you have ever done?

Note: The essays will be anonymous. The answers will be read and the winners are chosen by a volunteer panel of William Penn teachers and administrative staff. **Any application with answers deemed inappropriate by the awards committee will be excluded. **
